


Ramsey Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 11, which is located in the Twin Cities Planning Region.

POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS



Ramsey Co. is the 2nd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased so far this decade, ranking as the 83rd fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Ramsey Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a smaller percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Ramsey Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Ramsey Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Ramsey Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT








LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.7%, Ramsey Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Ramsey Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3% prepandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Ramsey Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Ramsey Co. averaged an annual loss of fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward,




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Twin Cities returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).





LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Ramsey Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Ramsey Co. is more racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



Ramsey Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Ramsey Co. had the 18th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Ramsey Co. had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$17.82 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$23.01 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$27.78 in 2024, wages were higher in Region 11 than the state. Overall, Region 11 had the highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$63.5) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$15.6) (see Table 11).

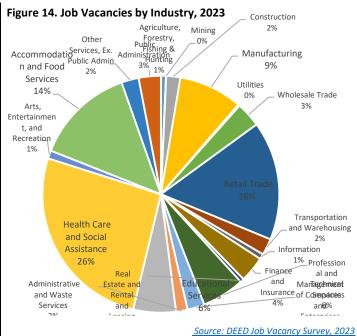



Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


